# California Used Mattress Recovery and Recycling Act

## What is the MRC?

- In 2013, California passed SB-254 creating a statewide mattress recycling program
- Mattress Recycling Council (MRC) was created by the International Sleep Products Association (ISPA), the trade association for the mattress industry
- Non-profit with targeted task of implementing recycling laws in states with supporting legislation (CT, CA, RI)
- Certified by, and has oversight by CalRecycle

## Program Objectives

- ✓ Increases the number of mattresses recycled
- ✓ Effectively communicates with consumers
- ✓ Minimize the consumer recycling fee
- ✓ Prevents and reduces illegal dumping

## How is the Program Funded?

- Visible mattress recycling fee on all CA mattress sales
- \$11.00 per unit fee on all sales effective December 30, 2015
- No free-riders; applies to all in-state and on-line sales
- Retailers collect and remit fees directly to MRC

## Solid Waste Facility Collection Network

- All permitted solid waste facilities are eligible
- Contracted locations will accept mattresses from consumers at no cost
- Collection sites to date:
  - ✓ 85 Contracted
  - ✓ 22 Pending contracts
  - ✓ 75-100 more possible location

## Further Expansion?

- One-day collection events to augment existing infrastructure
  - MRC provides on-site labor, trailer, transport and recycling at no cost
  - Best coordinated with other bulky/difficult to manage material events (HHW, e-waste, paint, white goods, tires)
- Non-profits, mattress retailers, university clean-outs, military installations, others

## Mattress Recyclers

- RFP: spring of 2015
- 7 companies, 11 locations under contract
- Have capacity to service entire state
- Variety of transport containers and service providers
- Over 125,000 units recycled to date
- Soft launch, metered expansion

## Illegal Dumping

- Program structured to prevent illegal dumping through:
  - No cost retailer pick-up from consumer
  - No cost drop off at solid waste facilities
  - Consumer incentive at recycling facilities
- \$750,000 fund established for 2016
- Basic annual reporting required
- On-line registration active; over 40 registered collectors

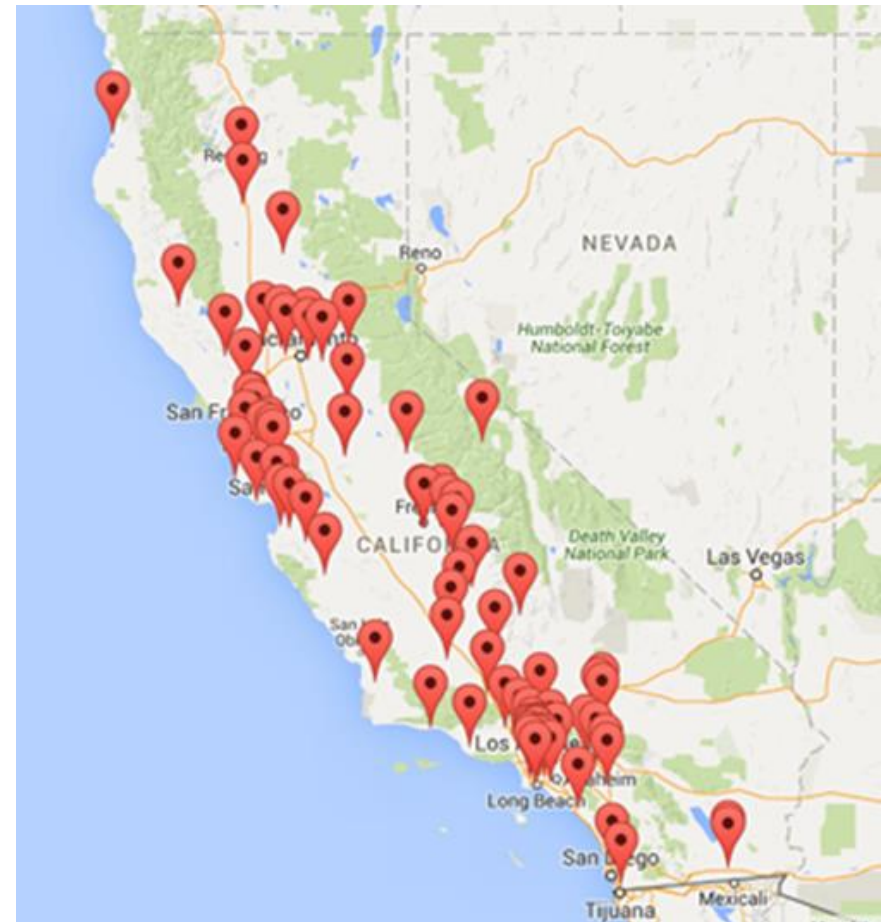
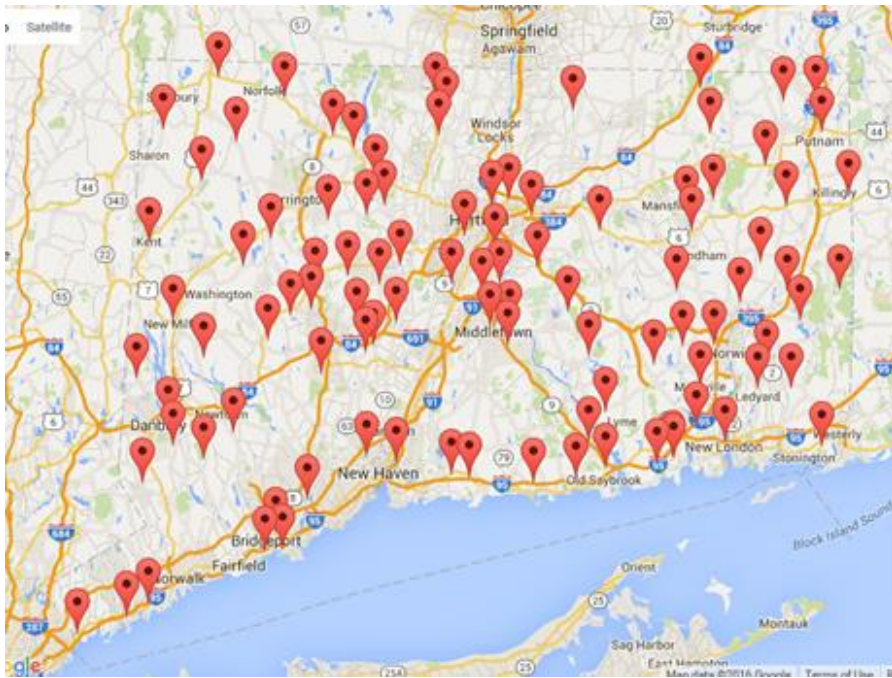
